## PRIME MINISTER VISITS HIS NEW YORK FAMILY

On September 26, 1998, Prime Minister Shri Atal Behari Vajpayee ji managed to spend a short hour, from his very busy schedule, in New York Hilton's Madison Suite, with a small number of his New York parivar made up of karyakartas from HSS, VHP of America, OFBJP, IQG, HSC, Seva Samiti, and Sikh Sangat of America.

Chancellor Bhisma Agnihotri, head of US parivar, welcomed him in his warm style. Atal ji responded both in seriousness and humor; how can one be welcomed in his own family? A sentence and sentiment that electrified all present there.
